

that began long ago before Europeans arrived. To the Maliseet Indians, it was Wolastog, the good and bountiful river. Many waterways in the system still have aboriginal names, among them Chemquasabamticook, Temiscouata, and Nashwaaksis.

The St. John River received its current name on June 24, 1604, the feast day of St. John the Baptist, when the expedition of the Sieur de Monts and Samuel de Champlain dropped anchor at the river's mouth.
